 $L = X^*20/N_R$ ----- Eqn (1)

Where: NB = No. of boats

N = No. of CDs + 1 in Mr. S.Hunts CD collection

L = Length of boat in feet X = No. of vikings/boat 20 = No. of people expected

Mr. Polite gave an example where : number of vikings/boat = 10

number of boats = 2

Putting these into Eqn (1) gives :

$$L = 10*20/2$$

= 100 ft

The committee thought this was rather excessive, Mr. Polite hastily checked his derivation and re-defined the variable X so that:

X = Space (feet)/average percentile person

Putting X = 1.5 ft in the above example now gives L = 15 ft.
